As the festival comes to a close, we are excited and proud to present, *LOW MOVIE*, a sneak preview/world premiere screening in the band's hometown (maybe you can help them find a title for the film!). Since Low's debut in 1994, director Philip Harder has been shooting 16mm film for the band. His Low short *Looking Out for Hope* won best experimental film at the very first SXSW film festival in 1995. This gritty film became trademark Low as the band pushed a wooden boat across frozen Lake Superior in -20° windchill. Several music videos and films later we are capturing the band through a conceptual edit of all of Harder's original 16mm footage of Low, 1994 to 2010. But this is not a collection of music videos, nor a documentary-it's something else. What that is, is yet to be discovered, perhaps it's just a Low experience.

Following the film, please join us once again at the Historic Greysolon Plaza - this time downstairs in their unique Moorish Room. Festival guests will be treated to a feast for the eyes courtesy of featured director/filmmaker Philip Harder's film/art installation, in addition to complimentary appetizers from Black Woods Catering and free Schell's beer and drink specials all evening. MUSIC LINE-UP



SOLID GOLD: Following the release of their latest CD, "Bodies of Water," Minneapolis buzz band Solid Gold has spent the year mesmerizing critics and fans with its electronic pop. Solid Gold sends out waves of dreamy, hypnotic synth pop colored with minor chords and warm, pulsing beats.



DJ TALK RADIO: DJ Talk Radio (Ken Hannigan) of Anthem Heart acclaim is an accomplished and sought after DJ in the Twin Cities. Known for his monthly "Worn to be Wild" studio parties where he mixes hot beats to live screen-printing (he also takes this music/art exhibition on the road to festivals like Clapperclaw and SXSW).



CHARLIE PARR: Charlie Parr plays original and traditional folk and Piedmont-style blues, accompanying himself on National resonator guitar, 12-string guitar and sometimes a banjo. He's put out seven full-length releases, his latest album is called "Roustabout" and contains original and traditional folk music recorded in true monophonic sound.



ROMA DI LUNA: Roma di Luna is the wife-husband duo Channy Moon Casselle (vocals, violin) and Alexei Moon Casselle (guitar, vocals), who "make new old music". In 2004, they began performing as street musicians in downtown Minneapolis, and since then have released two full-length albums, two EPs, and casually transitioned their musical concept into a full-band affair.



BIGHT CLUB: Bight Club is a constant hip-hop energy that manifests out of Tony Tone and Nutzman, the original digital sound and lyrical creators of Bight Club. Wrapped inside of their element (the Minneapolis jungle) they are consistently throwing bight nights and shows, whether it is a performance or a track, they're always trying their hardest to push hip-hop and music further into its evolution.



HEIRUSPECS: With an extraordinary live show, the crew "is a sprawling magnum opus that captures all the elements that makes this collective appealing and the musicianship here is remarkable" states Alan Pounds/ MN Hip Hop Fiend. Recommended to any music fan..."This is hip-hop, but it's grown man's hip-hop. Hip-hop with a message. Hip-hop anyone can respect."

MUSIC LINE-UP



THE KEEP AWAYS: The Keep Aways is a post-riot grrl American punk band from Duluth, Minnesota. Since releasing their debut album in 2004, the band has toured the U.S. with Black Eyed Snakes. As part of the nationally-recognized Duluth music scene (Low, Black Eyed Snakes, Haley Bonar, Charlie Parr, If Thousands, etc.), the Keep Aways are growing their fan-base all over the country.



GASOLINE SILVER: Gasoline Silver is racks of subterranean wordplay scored with electro-psych panoramas and biker-movie guitars. Formed in 2009 in the Twin Cities, Gasoline Silver includes Ron Franklin (vocals, harp, guitar), Andy Hertel (drums), and Josh Misner (synthesizers). Prior to starting the band, Ron Franklin toured the U.S. and Europe with just a telecaster, a harmonica rack and a mess of feedback.



GAY WITCH ABORTION: Gay Witch Abortion showcases heavy talent and musicianship as the duo Shawn Walker and Jesse Bottomly puree a gigantic rhythmic stew of guitar and drums. So close your eyes. Imagine your childhood. Maybe you put your fingers into the ceiling fan. That hurts. But it brings a sense of power and risk. You do the wrong thing sometimes, instead of the right thing. There's blood and maybe you break something. There's definitely some trouble. And this is your soundtrack.



THE BITTER SPILLS: "Baby" Grant Johnson and Rich Mattson met in the late 1980's, when they were playing original rock and roll in & around Minneapolis. They each played in several bands since then, the main ones being for Grant: Beyond Zebra, Carpetbaggers, The New Vintage. Rich: the Glenrustles, Ol' Yeller. They started performing together for the first time in 2005 as the Bitter Spills. Grant Johnson's lifelong fascination with folk music wore off over the years on a more contemporary-trained Rich Mattson, and after the late 2004 "Minnesota Folk Tour" (that included Charlie Parr), Rich was infected with the folk style.



THE HONEYDOGS: With 10 studio releases and over 16 years under their belt, The Honeydogs have helped define the Twin Cities music scene. The band refers to the traditional soul and rock touchstones while creating something interesting, unpredictable, insightful, and moving: shades of the Stones' Exile on Main Street, Fresh-era Sly Stone, twilight Hendrix and Revolver-esque Beatles, all with lead singer Adam Levy's surreal, evocative and enigmatic lyrics winding sinuously through the savory mix.

SILENT LIGHT

Palisades Tartan Director of Theatrical Distribution and Publicity and Sound Unseen jury member Debbi Berlin introduces what is arguably the finest cinematic achievement of the decade. Director Carlos Reygadas' *Silent Light* is a meditative story about one man's inescapable, passionate love for two women, and the spiritual crises and redemption that follow. The film's emotional purity is linked to the community it portrays: a group of pacifist Mennonites who have resided in the Mexican state of Chihuahua since the 1920s. Much of the film's power is generated by its cast of Mennonite nonactors, who appear to live and breathe the deep convictions of their faith and traditions, lending a documentary-like feel to this poetic work. Reygadas' film is indebted to Carl Dreyer's 1954 masterpiece *Ordet*, with which it shares a profound and deeply felt belief in the sublime and the miraculous. Winner of the Grand Jury prize at the 2007 Cannes Film Festival for Reygades, *Silent Light* went on to screen at the most prestigious film festivals around the world including, Toronto, New York, London and Rio de Janeiro Int'l film festivals.

OCTOBER COUNTRY

Shot over the course of a year from one Halloween to the next, the film is a beautifully rendered portrait of three generations of a working class American family in upstate New York. With elliptical cinematography and an award-winning soundtrack, filmmaker Michael Palmieri and photographer and family member Donal Mosher detail many of the personal trials and tribulations of the Mosher family but, on a universal level, provide an honest insight into what is often too simply described as America's obsession with violence. Engrossing, rich, multi-layered and stunning to watch, the film has been compared to the music of Vic Chesnutt, "Sad, captivating...broken." Winner of the 2009 Silverdocs Grand Jury Prize and nominated for a 2009 Independent Spirit Award for Best Documentary.

WASTE LAND

Artist Vik Muniz is renowned for making portraits out of unusual objects—sugar, dirt, peanut butter, chocolate syrup. Here, filmmaker Lucy Walker (Blindsight, Countdown to Zero) follows Muniz as he returns to his native Brazil—to Jardim Gramacho, the largest landfill in the world, outside Rio de Janeiro. His plan is to create portraits, constructed entirely out of garbage, of the "catadores" who pick through the rubbish for recyclable items, and to give the profits from their sale back to his subjects. HIPSTERS

Hipsters is a candy-colored musical set in the drab Soviet Union of the 1950s. More political than Hairspray and way cooler than High School Musical, it inspired a wave of Hipster parties across Russia. The movie sets to music the story of a straight-laced young Communist party member named Mels. In the midst of a raid on a group of kids caught wearing American-style clothes and listening to jazz, he's smitten with an adorable Hipster named Polly, who sports bright red lipstick and a poodle skirt. Casting caution and his grey uniform to the wind, the newly christened "Mel" barters on the street for a saxophone and a snappy checkered suit with huge lapels, and soon he's cultivating an awe-inspiring pompadour. But as the Hipsters face growing up in Cold War society, they realize that life isn't always a song and dance. A smash hit at the 2009 Karlovy Vary, Toronto and Chicago International Film Festivals.

I AM SECRETLY AN IMPORTANT MAN

Peter Sillen's documentary portrait of the guru of grunge, Steven (Jesse) Bernstein, undulates like a spoken-word performance. Known in the Seattle art and music scene as one of the most influential voices of the late twentieth century, Bernstein was a poet and performance artist who recorded with Sub Pop Records and inspired Kurt Cobain, Oliver Stone, and many other writers, filmmakers, and grunge and punk musicians. Bernstein performed stories and songs about society's fringes-angry, tender, and sometimes corrosively humorous portraits of drifters, junkies, and ex-cons. His mentor, William Burroughs, said of his writing, "The work is deeply felt...Bernstein has been there and brought it back. Bernstein is a writer." I Am Secretly an Important Man recently screened at the Full Frame Documentary Film Festival in Durham, North Carolina.

SEX & DRUGS & ROCK & ROLL

The man who played Gollum and King Kong is now transforming into an equally volatile creature: punk rocker and new wave artist lan Dury. BAFTA nominee Andy Serkis plays The Blockheads front man like the circus ringmaster at a carnival of dysfunction (known to the rest of us as the 70's and 80's). This unconventional biopic follows Dury: a man whose tenacity allowed him to overcome the debilitating effects of a botched childhood and polio, and who challenged those closest to him to have the same strength of character. Director Mat Whitecross expertly structures the film as if it were one of Dury's songs, with vivid vignettes and a new wave tempo, while pop artist Peter Blake lends his trademark aesthetic. Sex & Drugs & Rock & Roll premiered at the 2010 Berlinale International Film Festival before rocking audiences at Tribeca & Seattle International Film Festivals

SOME DAYS ARE BETTER THAN OTHERS

Some Days are Better Than Others is a poetic, character-driven feature-length film featuring Carrie Brownstein (of Sleater-Kinney) and James Mercer (The Shins and Broken Bells) that asks why the good times slip by so fast while the hard times always seem so sticky. Written and directed by Matt McCormick, Some Days are Better Than Others is a sad valentine to the forgotten discards of a throwaway society, and a story about knowing when to hold on, and when to let go. The film premiered at South by Southwest Film Festival (SXSW).

WHEEDLE'S GROOVE

Wheedle's Groove is a feature documentary about Seattle's long-lost soul and funk music scene of the 1960s and 70s. With commentary by Seattle notable music figures like Quincy Jones, Sir Mix-A-Lot, Mark Arm (Mudhoney), Ben Gibbard (Death Cab For Cutie), Ben Shepherd (Soundgarden), Kim Warnick (The Fastbacks) and Kenny G, along with interview footage, archival materials, original music, and live performances, the film paints a picture of a thriving and vibrant music scene centered around the city's small African-American population. Wheedle's Groove has screened at the Atlanta, Seattle and Indie Memphis Film Festivals (where it also picked up the Audience Award).

LOW FILM CLOSING NIGHT FILM

Since Low's debut in 1994, director Philip Harder has been shooting cinematic 16mm films for the band: a boat on frozen Lake Superior, Baron Von Raschke with red balloons, a room collapsing in slow motion around the band. Several music videos and film shorts later, all of Harder's raw footage of Low from 1994 to 2010 has been reedited into a film with original on-camera sounds. Rarities, banned clips, and unfinished Low films were unearthed.



DON MCGLYNN - Director

Don McGlynn was born in Minneapolis, Minnesota and attended Lake Forest College (near Chicago, Illinois) and the University of Southern California - Division of Cinema. While at USC, he hosted many film retrospectives where he invited Orson Welles, John Cassavetes, Sam Peckinpah, Martin Scorsese, Clint Eastwood, Sam Fuller, Don Siegal, Walter Murch, Roger Corman and many others, to present their work. During his time at USC, he filmed and edited Fat Chance, which won over 30 awards including the Cine Eagle, and edited For Heaven's Sake (based on the Mozart short opera The Impressario), which won the Student Academy Award from the MPAAS. His documentaries have been presented at over 200 international film festivals, and have won a number of awards. His directing credits included: Ed Thigpen: Master of Time, Rhythm, and Taste (2009), The Howlin' Wolf Story (2003), The Legend of Teddy Edwards (2001), Louie Prima: The Wildest! (1999), Charles Mingus: Triumph of the Underdog (1998), and Glenn Miller: America's Musical Hero (1992).

PHILIP HARDER - Director

Philip Harder is a Wisconsin native, but developed most of his career in Minneapolis, MN and is known for his knack of visual design and strong narrative that has made him one of the most widely respected music video Director's today. Philip got his directing start in the mid-80's shooting low budget punk rock music videos, experimenting with Super 8, 16mm and still formats. His first MTV video break was a clip for Soul Asylum. He has directed over 150 music videos, numerous short films and commercials including Apple iPod, Gap, Sprint, Target, Sony, Smirnoff, NHL, Hewlett Packard. Music videos include but are not limited to Incubus. Prince. Foo Fighters, Hilary Duff, Pulp, Cornershop, Barenaked Ladies, Liz Phair, Yellowcard, Rob Thomas, Matchbox Twenty, Low, The Owls, Sun Volt. Some of his most notable awards are for Best Experimental Film in 2008 at the Brooklyn International Film Fest, the 2008 Jury prize winner at the Dance on Camera Film Fest at Lincoln Center, the MVPA award for Best Alt Music Video for Incubus' "Drive", the AICP-MOMA award, an MTV nomination for Best Group Video and a nomination for MVPA's Director of the Year.

JURORS



AL MILGROM

Al Milgrom is a venerable force of cinematic nature. Having founded University Film Society in 1962, with projections on a white wall in a University of Minnesota building. Milgrom went on to co-found the Minneapolis/St. Paul International Film Festival, and Minnesota Film Arts. A filmmaker in his own-right, Milgrom's long anticipated RED BARN documents a period of Minneapolis social upheaval in the 1960's. Now in his 80's he remains an active and impassioned advocate of cutting edge national and international cinema.



DEBBI BERLIN

Debbi Berlin has been actively involved in the entertainment, film and distribution business for over six years. She heads the theatrical department at Palisades Tartan, booking films in theaters across the country and securing press from prestigious news outlets. Her past three films were New York Times critic's picks, and two of them landed spots on Roger Eberts's "Top 10 films of 2009" list. Prior to joining the Palisades family, she ran the PR division, both theatrical and DVD, for Tartan Films. In early 2008, she started Berlin Public Relations whose clients have included Imperia Entertainment and the American Film Institute.



JENNY JONES

Jenny M. Jones has worked in film exhibition at such venues as the Northwest Film Center in Portland, OR, and the Oak Street Cinema in Minneapolis. She is currently the Program Manager of the Film/Video department of the Walker Art Center. She is the author of The Annotated Godfather: The Complete Screenplay. Her first concert was Cyndi Lauper's "Girls Just Wanna Have Fun" tour.



MARY MURPHY

Representative Mary Murphy is a life-long resident of Hermantown, Minnesota and has long been involved in local DFL politics. She was a labor union and community activist and in 1968 she was a Humphrey delegate at the National Democratic Convention in Chicago. Elected to office in 1976, she is currently serving her 17th term as State Representative for House District 6B and is the third most-senior member of the House. Currently, Representative Murphy is the Chair of the Cultural and Outdoor Resources Finance Division as well as the Ethics Committee at the Minnesota House of Representatives.



KATHIE SMITH

Kathie Smith is a graduate from the University of Minnesota with a Bachelors of Fine Art and a minor in Chinese. An avid film and music lover, Kathie is a freelance writer who contributes film reviews and features to the Minneapolis Star Tribune, as well as music and film reviews for the online magazine In Review Online. Her writing has also been translated for the Italian online magazine Rapporto Confidenziale. She has interned in the film/video department at the Walker Art Center and currently serves on the advisory board for Take-Up Productions and the Trylon Microcinema in Minneapolis.
